
Phone Use

DIWALI

Diwali is India's most important holiday of the year and is celebrated around the world. Originally a Hindu festival, Diwali is now celebrated by most Indians regardless of their faith. Diwali means "row of lighted lamps" and is the Festival of Lights. It is celebrated over 5 days. It is said that Diwali is as important to Hindus as Christmas is to Christians. Diwali is celebrated between mid-October and mid-November. The main festival night of Diwali is determined by when the darkest, new moon night occurs. People prepare for Diwali by cleaning and decorating their homes and offices. On Diwali night, people dress up, light lamps and candles inside and outside, join in prayers and enjoy fireworks and family feasts including sweets. People also exchange gifts and celebrate with dancing, music and storytelling. The biggest Vancouver Diwali celebration is the annual Vancouver Celebrates Diwali Festival organized by the Diwali Celebration Society. This festival goes on for a week and celebrates Diwali as well as South Asian arts and culture. Their mission is to break down cultural barriers – that's what we want to do at Brighouse too.
