Dear Families,

While we are happy to have our new playground, it has come with it's challenges with most of our students continuing to play there. Having large numbers of children play in one area has meant that there have been times when students have been bumped, pushed, or hit while playing. While Ms Scharf and Ms Pantaleo have been working on addressing those incidents on an individual basis, moving forward we have come up with a plan to help ensure that all children are safe while playing outside. Our plan includes talking with students about safe play, developing safe play posters for our school, as well as developing a rotation system for students so that fewer children are able to use the playground at a time. Families, we hope that you can also help by talking with your children at home about making safe choices while on the playground. School staff do not supervise outside of school hours. Parents and caregivers are responsible for supervising their children after 2:45pm.

TCO2 Workshops For Intermediate Students

Each year intermediate students across the Richmond School District learn from presenters in a workshop called 'Taking Care of Ourselves , Taking Care of Others. This unique workshop is designed and delivered by youth, for youth about preventing sexual exploitation. Using monologues, role-plays and engaging activities, two young adult facilitators involve participants in a meaningful and interactive discussion of what sexual exploitation is, who is involved, and how to prevent it from happening. Following each workshop, TCO² provides a safe space for youth to ask questions and come forward with disclosures about any concerns they have.

The workshops are age appropriate and divided into a Grade 4/5 presentation, and then a Grade 6/7 presentation. The Grade 4/5 one is happening this week on Tuesday.
